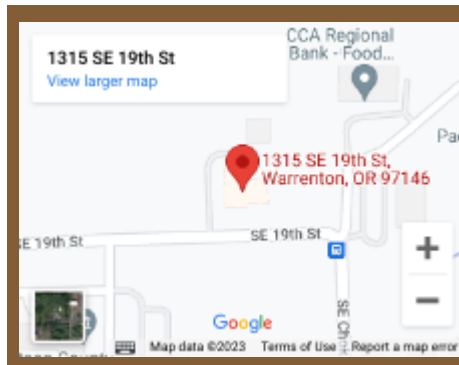

# All Clatsop County Residents are required by law to license their dogs annually

- A license is required even when a dog is always indoors or on a farm.
- Dogs are required to wear their license tag when not at their owner's land or home. (ORS 609.100)
- Dog owners may purchase 1-year or 3-year licenses.
- Three-year licenses are only issued with proof of 3-year rabies vaccine.
- License renewal may be done by the last day of the month of issue to avoid a late fee.



## 10 reasons to license your dog

1. Quickly identifies that your pet is not a stray.
2. If lost, it guarantees your dog a place to stay, a full stomach and tender loving care at our shelter.
3. Ensures your pet will receive emergency medical treatment if needed.
4. Offers assurance that you will be called if your dog is found.
5. Reduces the spread of rabies virus in animals and humans.
6. Enables Animal Control to protect our neighborhoods.
7. Provides funds for the care of the homeless animals at our shelter.
8. Provides an opportunity to find good homes for homeless dogs and cats through our adoption and foster programs.
9. Pays for investigations of animal cruelty, abuse, abandonment and neglect.
